During her 30 years of service to the SGRC, Lisa expertly navigated the ever-changing environment while always ensuring that the services provided by the Regional Commission met the myriad of needs in Southern Georgia. Her leadership resulted in many milestones including the construction of the beautiful new Valdosta office which graces the cover of this report. Best wishes to Lisa for a truly happy retirement.


Like they say though, when one door closes, another one opens and with Lisa's retirement came the appointment of Kimberly Hobbs as SGRC Executive Director. Kimberly's 26 years of service to the regional commission has equipped her to lead our organization into the future. I anticipate that under her direction, the Southern Georgia Regional Commission will continue to be the premier RC in the state and that it will innovate and adapt to meet the needs of all local governments in the region. In FY23, the committed staff of the SGRC administered programs and services that increased the quality of life for Southern Georgia's citizens. The Area Agency on Aging served over 350,000 congregate and home delivered meals to senior citizens in the region. For the second year in a row, the SGRC-AAA received the First Place Platinum Award for its Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program which provided 4,700 vouchers to seniors for Georgia Grown fruits and vegetables. Regional Transit provided over 185,000 trips for senior citizens, Department of Behavioral Health and Department of Human Services clients, non-emergency medical transport, Meals-on-Wheels, and others. The Workforce Development division assisted nearly 900 adults, youth, and dislocated workers in overcoming significant barriers to employment.

Community and Economic Development helped local governments in securing \$17.6 million in grant funding for various infrastructure and housing improvement projects. These projects will benefit over 120,000 Southern Georgians. The Lending division made 11 loans with a combined total project cost of \$17 million and 152 jobs created. In its vital role of overseeing the SGRC's budget, the Finance division ensured that this organization is a good steward of all public funding. In FY23, for every \$1 collected in dues, the SGRC region received \$36 in federal, state, and local funding.

The mission of the SGRC is to develop, promote, and provide services that make the Southern Georgia region a better place to live and work. As you will see in this report, the leadership and staff of the SGRC are achieving that mission. I encourage you to thoroughly review the annual report's valuable contents, and to share the achievements of this essential agency with those who may not know about its endeavors.



The SGRC's Lending division provides financing to small business owners for development of new businesses or expansion of existing businesses through several different loan programs. Lending is setup as two separate non-profit agencies governed by one Loan Board of Directors. The Southern Georgia Area Resource Development Agency (ARDA) operates an EDA/USDA Rural Development funded revolving loan fund (RLF) totaling nearly \$6 million. The Southern Georgia Area Development Corporation (ADC) is a Certified Development Corporation with the Small Business Administration (SBA) charged with making SBA 504 loans for commercial businesses and packaging SBA 7(a) Guaranteed loans on behalf of local lending institutions.






ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES





The SGRC's Regional Transit division provides rural transportation services for the benefit of the public and disadvantaged populations, including persons with disabilities, older adults, and persons without a vehicle. The program enhances rural area mobility and improves access to health care, shopping, education, employment, public services, and recreation. By coordinating funding from the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), Georgia Department of Human Services (DHS), Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (Medicaid), and other private pay contracts, the program provides, on average, 350 trips per day to the citizens in the eighteen-county region.

The SGRC Transportation Division supports local governments in their transportation planning endeavors by delivering vital services and promoting measures aimed at safeguarding and enhancing the regional transportation network. Acting as the federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Valdosta Urbanized Area, the SGRC engages in an array of both immediate and long-range planning initiatives within and surrounding the metropolitan Valdosta area. Furthermore, the division extends its transportation planning support to rural counties in the region, prioritizing multi-modal transportation planning, rural transit planning, and diverse transportation infrastructure projects.



TRANSPORTATION PLANNING FUNDS LEVERAGED All Programs Combined





This division administers the federally funded Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program. WIOA is landmark legislation that is designed to (1) strengthen and improve our nation's public workforce system, (2) help get Americans, including youth and those with significant barriers to employment, into high-quality jobs and careers, and (3) help employers hire and retain skilled workers.






DISLOCATED PERFORMANCE MEASURES

The SGRC's Area Agency on Aging (AAA) develops, provides, coordinates, and advocates for services that assist older individuals, at-risk adults, persons with disabilities, their families, and caregivers. The vision of the AAA is to assist these individuals in Living Longer, Living Safely, and Living Well. AAA programs and services receive federal and state funding through a contract between the SGRC and the GA Department of Human Services and between the SGRC and the GA Department of Community Health. While some services are provided by AAA staff, most programs are sub-contracted to cities, counties, and other organizations that contribute local monies to provide services directly in their communities.

The SGRC-AAA Division's Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) was awarded the "First Place Platinum Award" for a second year in a row. The First Place Platinum Award recognizes the AAA with the highest number of vouchers redeemed in Georgia for the SFMNP. The SFMNP encourages healthy eating by making fresh Georgia-grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs available at approved market sites to seniors living in the Southern Georgia region. Scott Courson, SGRC-AAA Aging Director, stated "this program is especially important because South Georgia is known as a food desert, with very limited options for people to access fresh fruits, vegetables, and other grocery items."




