PLANNING SERVICES

SGRC assists local governments in completing comprehensive plan updates, drafting local development regulations, updating Hazard Mitigation Plans, and by providing other specialized planning studies. In addition, planning staff assist with needs identified in adopted Community Work Programs and by hosting training and development workshops. The Planning program provides information and public policy options to local governments based on sound research and analysis. Through continuous outreach, we help our member governments maintain Qualified Local Government status which allows them to receive state and federal funding. Planning activities focus on fulfilling community and regional visions and goals as well as the protection of the region's environmental and cultural resources. SMALL BUSINESS LENDING

SGRC's loan program provides financing to small business owners for development of new businesses or expansion of existing businesses through several different loan programs. Small Business Lending is setup as two separate non-profit agencies governed by one Loan Board of Directors. The Southern Georgia Area Resource Development Agency (ARDA) operates an over \$6 million-dollar EDA/USDA Rural Development funded revolving loan fund (RLF) and the Southern Georgia Area Development Corporation (ADC) is a Certified Development Corporation with the Small Business Administration charged with making SBA 504 loans for commercial businesses and packaging SBA 7(a) Guaranteed loans on behalf of local lending institutions.

The mission is to promote industrial and commercial business development and job creation throughout the 18-county region through a public-private partnership with regional financial institutions. In conjunction with the banking industry, the Small Business Lending Department provides "gap" financing to viable businesses.

GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS (GIS)

SGRC's Geographic Information Systems program develops and maintains geographic information system (GIS) data and applications for governments in Southern Georgia and beyond.

GIS technology is all about making better decisions through query and analysis of spatial data and is used extensively in the Southern Georgia region. Local governments utilize GIS technology and data developed by SGRC to handle everything from monitoring growth and parcel assessment to crime analysis and emergency response planning. The SGRC's Area Agency on Aging (AAA) develops, provides, coordinates, and advocates for services that assist older individuals, at-risk adults, persons with disabilities, their families, and caregivers. The vision of the AAA is to assist these individuals in Living Longer, Living Safely, and Living Well.

AAA programs and services receive federal and state funding through a contract between the SGRC and the Department of Human Services and between the SGRC and the Department of Community Health. While some services are provided by AAA staff, most programs are sub-contracted to cities, counties, and other organizations that contribute local monies to provide services directly in their communities.

The SGRC's Community and Economic Development Program provides technical assistance to local governments in identifying projects to improve community programs and facilities (Grant funded projects include street paving and drainage, water and sewer, public buildings, neighborhood revitalization, streetscape and pedestrian facilities, as well as police and fire department facilities, equipment, and vehicles.); developing related grant and loan applications; and administering funded projects. Community and Economic Development activities are designed to promote regional economic development, to assist local communities in increasing their economic development capacity, to identify funding to assist with the location and expansion of new and existing industry, and to facilitate activities which encourage business development and job creation in order to enhance the standard of living for area residents. The SGRC's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) identifies problems and barriers to economic development, and proposes strategies to overcome these barriers. TRANSPORTATION & ENVIRONMENTAL

The SGRC's Transportation and Environmental Programs serve local governments in planning activities and deliver vital transportation services to clients. Since 2002, the SGRC has been the federally-designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Valdosta Urbanized Area, carrying out various long- and short-range transportation planning activities around metropolitan Valdosta. The SGRC also provides transportation planning services to rural counties in the region through a funding partnership with the Georgia Department of Transportation. These services are primarily focused on rural transit and bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure planning. The SGRC Coordinated Human Service Transportation Program serves, on average, 500 trips per day (for clients of Georgia Department of Human Services and other state agencies). These individuals receive transportation for a number of purposes including medical appointments, senior center attendance, and mental health program participation.

Partnering with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, Environmental Protection Division, local governments and private landowners, the SGRC Environmental Services Program develops and implements water quality best management practices along rivers and streams throughout the region.
